Partners across the whole of Sunderland, Washington and beyond are offering a unique opportunity to explore and share our heritage with events, activities and attractions for children and adults of all ages.




Sunderland History Fair 2024

The Temple is a Grade-1 Listed Building. A recent regrading by Historic England has resulted in it being graded in the top 2.5% of listed buildings in the country, and as such has been classified as of extreme importance to the nation's heritage, putting it on a par with many cathedrals and stately homes throughout England.

Queen Street Temple is the oldest purpose-built Masonic Temple under the English Constitution in existence and is still in continuous use today by the very Lodge that built it.
