Holy Trinity Church, built in 1719 to coincide with Sunderland's emergence as a parish in its own right, has many dazzling features. This 300 year old building has many stories to tell. Explore the story of orphan William Elliot's letter from the past, hidden symbolism in stained glass or the vestry table where decisions about Sunderland's future were made. Stay for coffee and ask a member of staff about other upcoming concerts, workshops and lectures.

Discover Stockton Road United Reformed Church, open to the public this Heritage Open Days festival. The red sandstone church of 1890, with its lantern tower, is a well-known local landmark. The features that can be seen inside include impressive stained glass windows, along with war memorials and furniture from several former Presbyterian and Congregational Churches.



Ryhope Engines Museum - Open Days

Ryhope Pumping Station is a distinctive example of the industrial architecture of mid Victorian times. The two giant 1868 Woolf Compound beam engines will be working with steam power provided by a hand-fired 1908 Lancashire boiler. Talk to our volunteers, on hand to help enhance your visit, ask our blacksmith to make you a memento and complete your tour with a visit to our popular Gatehouse tearooms for a cuppa and a selection of our cakes and snacks freshly made on-site.

Celebrate 50 years of Heritage at NELSAM

This is an important year for NELSAM, with two significant anniversaries: its foundation by a group of enthusiasts in 1974 and registration as a charity in 1984. This is an opportunity to see how the collection has grown over 50 years, from a few aeroplanes in a field, to the thriving regional transport collection with brand new exhibits for 2024. Housed on a 4-acre site near the Nissan factory NELSAM traces the regional aviation history from 1908 onwards.

Phoenix Hall Masonic Temple Open Days

A unique Grade-1 listed building in the Palladian style. Recently restored thanks to a Historic England grant, and used by Phoenix Lodge who built it from 1785 to the present day. Original features include the sunburst ceiling, organ and medieval drains found in archaeological digs. Members will be on hand to explain the building's fascinating history.

Fulwell Mill Open Days

Come along for a free tour of this iconic Sunderland landmark. Fulwell Windmill appeared on the Sunderland skyline in 1806 and became the familiar landmark we know today when opened in 1808. Built for Joseph Swan out of magnesian limestone from the adjacent quarry, it retained its links with the Swan family for many years. 1839 saw the only recorded fatality at the mill when a journeyman miller, William Wren, was thrown from the sails during a violent storm.

Bowes Railway Open Days

Historic Bowes Railway vard is offering free auided tours to the public. There will also be a forge demonstration in the tub shop. Bowes Railway was originally a colliery railway built to carry coal mainly from pits in north west Durham to the Tyne at Jarrow. The earliest section was designed by George Stephenson and opened on 17 January 1826, making it one of the world's first modern railways.

Sunderland Minster Open Days

A church dedicated to St. Michael stood here since Anglo Saxon times. It now features stained glass windows by William Morris, Marion Grant and Thomas Denny, a weeping chancel, a pulpit turned into an altar and significant war memorials. Past rectors of Bishopwearmouth Church include a pope, the theologian William Paley and the brother of the Duke of Wellington. It was created a Minster by the Bishop of Durham in 1998.

The surrounding Albany Park is land reclaimed from the former colliery. Mosedale Gillatt Architects are preparing designs for F Pit's refurbishment, including a Heritage Visitor Centre and cafe, and outdoor exhibition space. Work on the first phase of improvements to the surrounding Albany Park has already begun. Come and learn about the plans for this unique heritage site. Pre-booking not required.
